Jan's Towing Hooks Plane Out of Rio Hondo Wash

EL MONTE - A plane made an emergency landing in the Rio Hondo Wash because of a fuel issue. It had to be fished out of the wash the next day. So, who has a pole big enough for the job... Jan's Towing at your ser-

The pilot made an emergency landing in the wash because it appeared that he ran out of fuel. He felt he couldn't make it to the El Monte Airport. He landed safely in a few inches of water. However, instead of walking in the water to the edge of the wash in the dry area, he stayed on the wing until help came. Thus, a full blown expensive air rescue was initiated where a helicopter was brought in and used to pluck the pilot, Jesse Ramos, from the wing. He wasn't hurt in any way, just maybe his pride for not having enough fuel.

The next issue was, how to get the plane out. Couple of options, fuel it and fly it out, tow it out or fish it out with a large tow rig. They came the next day to "fish" it out.

The program was to push or tow the plane to the Lower Azusa Bridge and then pluck the plane out of the water from

there with a huge towing rig.

Jan's Towing brought in their big rig towing unit and it ended up being a piece of cake for them. The police blocked off Lower Azusa Road at both ends of the bridge and Jan's Towing went to work. It looked like a gigantic fishing pole extending from the bridge and over the water. They secured the plane, a Beechcraft BE 35 four passenger plane which weighs in at 1,500 lbs. empty, and pulled it up to the road.

This method was used because flying the plane out of the wash would be dangerous. Towing from the wash was compromised because of the wing-span of the aircraft.

After getting it on the road, the plane was towed back to the airport with a police escort.

Jan's towing has been known for getting rough situations cleared and has a great history of recovering vehicles... and planes. If they say it can't be done, Jan's Towing will do it. It's amazing what this company can do.

West Covina Unified Breaks Ground on Science/Career Technical Education Building

WEST COVINA – West Covina Unified broke ground on a science and career technical education (CTE) building at West Covina High School on June 25, commemorating the District's latest effort to create innovative, effective learning environments.

The 28,000 square-foot science and CTE building will house new chemistry and biology labs, a state-of-the-art video production lab and broadcast studio, engineering computer labs and robotics spaces that feature a competition arena and manufacturing

"West Covina Unified is committed to providing students with facilities and resources that inspire excellence, and thanks to the support of our community, we have the means to do so," WCUSD Superintendent Charles D.

Hinman said. "We are excited to break ground on this new facility and move one step closer to offering West Covina High School students a place where they can explore the sciences and develop crucial career-focused skills."

The \$15.7 million project, funded by the voter-approved Measure ES, begins construction in late July and is expected to be completed in time for the 2020-21 school year. The building will be the District's

first two-story structure.

It is one of the District's many new major construction projects in its facilities program, in addition to modernization projects at campuses across the District.

West Covina High is the District's Advanced Placement flagship school, offering 27 college-prep courses as well as 27 career technical education courses, including forensic science, architectural design and business robotics.



Three Arrested for Shooting at a Family in Car, 7-Year-old Girl Injured

By George Ogden **COVINA** - Back on June 15, Saturday evening around 11:00 p.m. a man (victim) got into an argument with two brothers Adam Jacob Robles, 22 and Marcos Robles, 28 while in a carport at the Petra Apartments, 235 W. Puente. The victim left the area with his kids and headed north when he notices the suspect's vehicle following them. The victim may have attempted to drive to the Covina police department and was headed east on College Street. Just passed Citrus Avenue, the suspects sped up and got in front of his car and cut off the victim forcing him to stop with his family in the car. One suspect got out and took aim with a firearm and fired into the car through the windshield. Glass and bullet fragments injured a sevenyear-old girl. The suspects then took off.

With an extensive investigation, the suspects were arrested at a motel in San Bernardino

on June 20 for their alleged involvement in the attempted murder case. The two brothers, Adam Jacob Robles, Marcos Robles, along with Victoria Lynn Williams, 26, appeared in court on Monday to answer to the charges of four counts of attempted murder. Duarte Council Declares Fiscal Emergency To Further Discussion

About Future Revenue Options DUARTE - At the June 25th dora, Pomona and Pasadena, City Council meeting, the Duwho face mounting annual

arte City Council voted unanimously to declare a fiscal emergency. With the start of the 2019-20 fiscal year on July 1st and to maintain service levels that ensures the City remains the vibrant community its residents cherish, Duarte will begin deficit spending. The current budget calls for the City to use a projected \$1.2 million from its General Fund reserve. This action is only a short-term solution and one that is not sustainable for the City's long-term financial future.

Like so many things in life, the cost of providing essential public services is also rising. Duarte's key revenues such as sales and property taxes are not keeping pace. Many of our neighboring cities are also grappling with these issues including Arcadia, Monrovia, Glen-

costs to programs and servic-The Council's action is one

of the many steps the City has taken and will take to continue to protect and maintain critical services. By declaring a fiscal emergency, Duarte can now give its residents the opportunity, as soon as the March 2020 ballot, to consider raising its sales tax from the current rate of 9.5% to 10.25% and keep all of the new revenue in Duarte to be spent locally. It is estimated this additional 3/4 cent will generate approximately \$2.6 million per year in revenue to both safeguard the City's long-term finances, as well as ensure that our residents and businesses continue to have access to the same, high-quality public safety, drinking water, recreation, youth, senior and transportation services it has enjoyed for over sixty years.

This action by the Council will not change the City's ability to deliver services that are used every day, and residents won't see any difference in the day-to-day operation of the community. Instead, this administrative action, required by California law, allows the Council to explore options to generate additional revenues to strengthen the City's finances including a revenue measure. Over 30 L.A. County cities have passed local sales tax measures, including most recently Glendora and Arcadia with San Gabriel and Monrovia later this year.

Overall, Duarte residents have a very positive image of their local government, especially their parks and recreation and safety services. In fact, in a recent survey, approximately 62 percent felt the City was going in the right direction and over two thirds of those surveyed believe Duarte needs additional funding to provide and maintain services.

The Duarte Council wants to continue the City's tremendous progress and feels strongly about giving their residents the ability to control their own destiny and can keep their tax dollars local should they choose.

The City Council and staff will continue providing updates on our collective efforts to protect the City's ability to deliver essential services.

Senator Chang Has Eight Bills Clear Major Hurdles

Senate Bill 35 combats human trafficking by creating a uniform system for governments and organizations to

The Fallen Journalists Memorial Foundation will plan the design, construction, operation, and maintenance with the National Parks Service (NPS). U.S. Senators Ben Cardin (D-MD) and Rob Portman (R-OH) have introduced the Senate companion bill.

Dating back to 1837, there have been more than 2.000 journalists who have wrongfully died while working toward

the promotion of the free press. This has included journalists who have died while covering military conflicts and wars, journalists who were wrongfully murdered, and journalists who died from ruthless acts of terror. One of the most recent and horrifying events was the Capital Gazette shooting in Annapolis, Maryland on June 28, 2018. During this tragic event, the gunman shot and killed five employees and injured two more.

The only memorial that exists to honor the sacrifices that these men and women have made is at the Newseum in Washington, D.C., which is slated to close at the end of 2019. With this closure, there will be no place where the public can go to honor those who gave their lives in the field of journalism.

"TIME JOCKEY" - Elder Statesman

Serving California.... When someone has served in a State elected office for over 30 years, he pretty much knows everything about his position and more. Jesse Unruh was that type of individual. He served as the State Treasurer and nursed California through its most difficult fiscal years in the 1960's and 1970's. When California was strapped for cash following Proposition 13, he designed an emergency bank financing plan to prevent the state from sinking further into debt. But Jesse Unruh just didn't fall into California politics, he survived life's challenges to become someone that clearly succeeded against the

Born to the parents of dirtpoor sharecroppers in Texas, Unruh served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and then attended the University of Southern California. He was elected to the California State Assembly representing the area of Inglewood and within seven years advanced to the speakership position. In this position, Unruh learned how to use his

authority through appointments and committee chairmanship. He quickly adapted to the power structure of Sacramento and with it came a growth in donations and fundraising making him an even more influential politician. Unruh ran the California Assembly with a stern fist and was often compared to Captain Bligh and Simon Legree for his iron fist methods, primarily used to get what he wanted. His chairmanship lasted seven years until the Democrats lost control but they were seven years on being the top politician.

When the Kennedy's were driving a new political base and course for America, Unruh was there to provide his support and knowledge of politics. But the Kennedy dream died with two assassinations and a poor decision, leading Unruh in a new direction. He ran against Ronald Reagan for the Governor of California and lost. In 1973, he ran for the Mayor of Los Angeles against Tom Bradley, and lost again. But opportunity knocked again in 1974 when the State Treasurer position opened up and using his name recognition, he easily won the position. The fiscal state of California was in disarray with high interest rates, bond indebtedness, and dwindling reserves. With no idea how big of a mess he had ac-

tually gotten into, Unruh fol-

lowed his experience as a leader of the California Assembly to rebuild the Treasurer's position into its own power hub. He stablished a network of political ties and persuaded the legislature to create committees to oversee the major projects financed by taxpayer monies. When the legislature agreed, it was Unruh as Treasurer who was named the chairman of each of the committees, eventually leading him to be named to 30 different boards and commissions, and allowing him to direct the projects of his choice.

Through this diplomacy, Unruh's campaign war chest grew to nearly \$600,000 from donations and his own income followed a similar growth pattern allowing him to own numerous properties from Sacramento, to San Francisco, to Los Angeles. Unruh's goal was to become Governor of California but he never realized his goal primarily as it would require nearly \$15 million dollars for a campaign run. Instead he chose to remain in the position as the most powerful elected official in state politics, a position that allowed him to keep his hands on the money...

Ignoring Trump Puts US At Risk

We've just watched the Democrat debates and some light discussion on illegal immigration and human trafficking at the border with no real solutions offered up. What seemed to be the center of the discussion was the Texas border and the conditions the children are subjected to there. Unacceptable by American standards which is why "... half of the Border Patrol workforce [has been] reassigned to humanitarian support duty ..." allowing migrants to slip through into the

What none of the Democrats focused on or mentioned was the original mission of the Border Patrol since founded in 1924 -preventing terrorists and weapons and the illegal entry of aliens into the United States. ICSVE, after interviewing 160 ISIS terrorists, reports one of them, in May, Abu Henricki al Canadi, a Canadian with dual Trinidad citizenship, told Speckhard and Shajkovci of a plot to move him into the U.S. through Mexico to attack the financial system in the U.S. He said this plot was masterminded by someone in America located in New Jersey.

and Henricki, and the interview was done in their prison.

The game plan, according to Henricki, was to smuggle him from Puerto Rico into Mexico and then across our southern border using the "standard" migration routes. Those standard routes it seems are those purportedly used on a regular basis when trafficking people in to the U.S.

In October 2018, Judicial Watch reported the Guatemalan President, Jimmy Morales, announced 100 ISIS terrorists had been apprehended as a large caravan of Unaccompanied Alien Children (UAC) was making its way north to our border. It would have been quite simple for them to infiltrate that caravan and due to the massive numbers, walk right into the U.S. undetected.

The Washington Times, October 25, 2018, reported the Judicial Watch charges ... "Guatemalan officials rescued seven unaccompanied children who were being smuggled inside the migrant caravan." Chris Farrell, Judicial Watch's director of investigations, said he monitored the caravan and saw men with gothic-script "MS" tattoos meaning they were likely members of the MS 13 gang.

· Gangs are responsible for murder, sex trafficking, armed robbery and trafficking in methamphetamine, heroin, cocaine and marijuana.

· Gangs use social media to communicate and recruit and encrypted mobile messaging applications to thwart law enforcement.

 Texas now ranks gangs with Tier I being the greatest threat and those are:

o Tango Blast and associated Tango cliques (Estimated 22,000-25,000 members)

o Texas Mexican Mafia (Estimated 4,000-6,000 members) o Mara Salvatrucha (MS-13) (Estimated 600-1,000 members) o Barrio Azteca (Estimated

,000-2,500 members) Raging Bull, an operation by Department of Homeland Security and Department of Justice, targeted the MS-13 gang. The first phase was conducted in El Salvador with 53 arrests. The second phase was conducted in the U.S. and ended up with 214 MS-13 arrests nationwide.

"Sixteen of the 214 arrested were U.S. citizens and 198 were foreign nationals, of which only five had legal status to be in the U.S. Foreign nationals arrested were from El Salvador (135), Honduras (29), Mexico (17), Guatemala (12), Ecuador (4) and Costa Rica (1). Sixty-four individuals had illegally crossed the border as unaccompanied alien children; most are now adults."

The annual Texas Gang Assessment Report 2018 reminds us: Gangs can be traditional or opportunistic ventures ... joining up with other gangs or the Mexican cartels ... drug smuggling or human trafficking of children or foreign terrorist groups ... but either way their targeted goal is to ensure financial gain and control ... CONTROL ... in capital


"This Is My Country To Have And To Hold"

He was a man without a country. At his trial he lashed out at the United States, and swore that he never wanted to hear its name again. In the story he was granted his wish, and until he died was shunted from one naval ship to another never touching these shores nor hearing its name. (Edward Everett Hale, The Atlantic December 1863)

While many of us occasionally have had serious arguments with the United States, it has remained our beloved homeland, and even when life's trajectory has taken us beyond its borders, "This is my home, my native land."

There have been times in my life when I disputed the policies and the actions of my country. But built into who we are is the right of protest, guaranteed by our Constitution. In my lifetime I have joined with others peacefully protesting its wars, its lack of civil rights, its failure to affirm the role of women, its disdain of gays and lesbians and its oft-legislated inequality. But those have been the debates that have slowly—perhaps too slowly—strengthened us instead of tearing us apart. And the right to disagree has been central to our identity. So despite its flaws,

I'm proud to be an American. These days, however, there is an increasingly foul taste in what has been the sweet American nectar. At home we have listened to the demeaning of our free press, the vulgar personal castigation of anyone daring to disagree with the President about anything, the brutal turning back of any policy seeking to ameliorate the planet's slow decay, the nation's wealth increasingly secured in the hands of the already wealthy, the curtailing of the rights of

America's workers, the threat to build a wall against those whose welcome is enshrined at the Statue of Liberty—and so much more. Instead of distorting Jesus, it is time for us to do what he asked: feed the world's hungry, care for the refugees, protect the children and preserve the earth which is God's gift.

Nevertheless, tomorrow is another celebration of the commitment of a people to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. We have much to celebrate this year including the one-hundreth anniversary of the Nineteenth Amendment guaranteeing women the right to vote. SO,

Every time there is a shooting of any kind there is a cry for more gun control from the liberal press and the politicians. The stated reason for this law by the politicians that created it was, 'there is no legitimate need for an ammunition clip that held more than 10 rounds'. This law was challenged in a federal court resulting in a ruling that this law was unconstitutional. In the suit (See Virginia Duncan vs. The state of California - penal Code 32310) brought in federal court there were a plethora of cases presented where if the intended

victim of a crime had more am-

would have been better able to properly defend themselves and in several cases likely would have been able to save their own lives. The federal Court agreed with the plaintiffs and ruled the law unconstitutional. Recent research on this issue leaves a lot of doubt about the status of this ruling as an appellate court appears to have issued a stay meaning that the state can continue to ban large capacity magazines.

Starting 1 July, 2019 to purchase rifle and shotgun ammunition in California the purchaser will have to undergo a background check and pay a fee of \$1.00 for every purchase. This law was ratified by the passing of a ballot initiative in 2016. If the purchaser is not a legal resident they cannot purchase any ammunition. Additionally, it will be a crime to bring ammunition purchased in another state into California. All this law will do is to prohibit honest gun owners from getting ammunition for legitimate purposes at a reasonable price. One, perhaps unintended, consequence of this law will be the eventual demise of shooting ranges because the cost to shoot there will become prohibitive. It is worth noting that Kim Rhode, a six time Olympic shotgun champion and others are suing the state to overturn this law as an infringement on Second Amendment rights.

Federal and state legislatures across this nation have passed numerous pieces of legislation aimed at banning "assault weap-

ons" (commonly AK47 and AR15 rifles) claiming that these weapons pose an existential threat to people's lives. The truth is that of the tens of thousands of deaths caused by violent acts in the last ten years about 300 lives have been taken at the muzzle of an assault rifle. Hand guns held by Chicago's inner city youths have claimed far more lives in a single year. Most of these weapons were either stolen or acquired through black market sources.

These laws and the myriad of other legislation that California and other legislatures, including the federal government, have passed has the stated purpose of fixing the problem of gun violence. Have all these laws prevented mass shootings like the one inflicted on the school children of Parkland Florida and the people in Las Vegas? No they have not because the problem is not guns it is deranged individuals.

The Best June Since 1938

Stock indices reacted favorably to the Federal Reserve's latest report and hit new highs recently. While the Fed is having a significant impact on the market, it is also important to keep a broad view of the economic and political landscape.

Personally, I did not think we would see a fresh new high in the stock market before a trade deal with China was consummated. The lesson here is to never underestimate the ability of the Twitter account of the U.S. President to create a short (covering) squeeze in stocks. The fact that the Fed has more or less promised a July fed funds rate cut also was significant. The July 2020 fed funds futures, which will settle about a year from now, also anticipates four 25 basis point rate cuts from the Fed. While that may happen, it remains far from certain.

If there is a trade deal with China, there likely would not be four fed fund rate cuts delivered as the U.S. economy very well may re-accelerate. There also is a tendency for major tax cuts to have a second-leg effect, after the initial sugar highs blow over (that is already behind us). There also still may be too much doom and gloom in investor sentiment because of the Chinese trade situation. Many investors fear a full-blown trade war might create a recession here (as well as in China). Doom and gloom investor attitudes have been supported by sharply weakening manufacturing indexes and other economic data in the U.S.

We are not in recession territory, but a 10-year low in U.S. Manufacturing PMIs is concerning. This may be one reason why the 10-year Treasury traded below 2% in the past month. Still, the Chinese have not devalued the yuan (yet). We are not in a recession. Why the 10-year Treasury yield dropped like a rock may be debated, but the answer likely recognizes what is happening in the rest of the world.

When the next recession comes, and when (or if) the Chinese decide to devalue the yuan, the 10-year Treasury yield could

be headed below 1%, similar to what many government bond markets in Europe and Japan have delivered. This is due to the willingness of the Fed to go to extreme monetarist measures to support the economy; and, because European and Japanese negative yields are pulling Treasury yields lower.

There are those on Wall Street that think that the next recession could be very serious - a repetition of the Great Recession of 2008. I do not believe that will be the case. The 2008 recession was manufactured in its severity, as the global banking system nearly stopped working. While certain large European banks like Deutsche Bank - have already "taken out" their 2008 stock market lows, it is unlikely that regulators, both here and in Europe, will let a Lehman-size institution fail. (For comparison purposes, Deutsche Bank's balance sheet is 3X the size of Lehman's at the time it failed.)

Furthermore, it is not the failure of Lehman Brothers that caused the 2008 Great Financial Crisis. Lehman was merely a catalyst, not a cause of the crash. The same decline in the stock market would have happened, but likely over a two-year period instead of one, because of improperly designed mortgage securities that were wiping out banks' balance sheets, combined with the shrinkage of available credit in the system.

Recently, European Central Bank (ECB) President Mario Draghi, in a speech in Portugal, signaled that an interest rate cut and more ECB stimulus (bond buying/quantitative easing) would be forthcoming. This

caused the euro to abruptly fall in value, the German 10-year bund to fall below -0.3%, and the 10-year U.S. Treasury bond to decline. Gold also hit a 14-month high over \$1,400 in the wake of Draghi's comments, since negative interest rates in Germany and other major European countries are forcing investors to increasingly look at alternative investments.

Complicating matters further, President Trump criticized ECB President Draghi on Twitter and implied that the ECB was purposely devaluing the euro and that a currency war may be forthcoming. President Trump's tweet said that Draghi's remarks "immediately dropped the Euro against the Dollar, making it easier for them to compete against the U.S. They have been getting away with this for years...."

President Trump also tweeted that he will have an "extended meeting" with Chinese President Xi at the G20 meeting, which sparked a stock market rally on the hope that there will be progress on the China tariff spat. In case you have not noticed, President Trump likes to have his trade fights one at a time, so if an unlikely China trade deal is reached fairly soon, then the European Union may be the next opponent to face the President's wrath in a tariff fight, especially in the wake of his latest ECB crit-

Now that the Mueller report isn't the daily fodder of the scandal-hungry press, all of a sudden news from Iran, China, Venezuela, Europe, Cuba and elsewhere is suddenly more relevant. Those trouble spots have been there all along, but spurious rumors of 2016 collaboration with Russia have wasted two years of mental focus for hundreds of Beltway scribes (which provided mainly boredom for 328 million Amer-

Addition to last week's Q & A regarding: Will my heirs have access to the money in my CDs when I die, or does this money have to go through probate?

IF you include a list of your beneficiary(-ies) with the bank where you put your money into a CD, your beneficiary(-ies) can access those funds by going to the bank and presenting your death certificate and their personal ID (usually a governmentissued photo ID). Otherwise, proceeds from a non-IRA bank CD go through probate and may be subject to expenses, delays, and lack of privacy.

I have a safety-deposit box at my bank. Are the contents FDIC insured?

No. FDIC does not insure the contents of safety-deposit boxes. You can contact your homeowner's insurance company agent and purchase your own insurance for this purpose. An alternative would be to purchase a good-quality safe for your home, and add to your homeowner's policy the value of whatever you put into your home safe.

Why do you only recommend certain annuities?

I recommend Fixed and Fixed-Index annuities, with very little or

no cost nor expense, up to 100percent participation (percent of your money that participates in potential growth), and *guarantees that you cannot lose your principal, locking in any growth each contract anniversary. (Some "Riders," added for additional benefits, can have an annual fee, but this is clearly disclosed to you before you invest; it's something you decide to include or not.) A good reason I don't recommend Variable annuities: The SEC warns people about the dangers of Variable annuities due to their costs, expenses, and risk to potential principal. *Guarantees are based on the strength of the insurance company issuing the annuity policy.)

My financial advisor told me I should buy an annuity from him because the insurance companies he represents are members of some California guarantee company that would assure my protection if the company went bankrupt. Is this true?

Your financial advisor has

crossed a legal line. Here's a quote from the California Life and Health Insurance Guarantee Association Act Summary Document and Disclaimer, "Insurance companies and their agents are prohibited by law from using the existence of the California Life and Health Insurance Guarantee Association (CLHIGA) to induce you to purchase any kind of insurance policy." The existence of this Association cannot be used by an agent or advisor to induce you to buy. Annuities are policies issued by insurance com-

We're retired and would like to downsize from our large home in the Inland Empire to a much smaller house closer to the beach. Our main concern is that we will lose our Prop. 13 property tax status. What can we do?

If you are 55 years old or older, you could sell your home and buy that beach house (of equal or higher value) and transfer your Prop. 13 property tax status with you!

More Than 17 Million Unsafe Airbags Remain In Vehicles On U.S. Roads

Today, in the U.S., more than 17 million recalled Takata airbags remain in vehicles on the road. A defective part inside the airbag can explode when the airbag deploys, potentially shooting sharp metal fragments at the driver and passengers. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has confirmed that 16 people in the U.S. have been killed, and hundreds of others alleged to have been injured, by this defect.

Affected vehicles include those made by BMW, Chrysler, Daimler, Ferrari, Ford, General Motors, Honda, Infiniti, Jaguar, Land Rover, Lexus, Mazda, McLaren, Mercedes-Benz, Mitsubishi, Nissan, Scion, Subaru, Tesla, Toyota and

cial media and other forms of communication urging them to contact their dealers immediately to schedule an appointment for a free recall repair.

Even if they haven't received a communication, all vehicle owners should check if their vehicle is affected by the Takata airbag recall by visiting www.SafeAirbags.com or www.NHTSA.gov/Recalls and entering their vehicle identification number (VIN).

Dealerships around the country have replacement parts available, and the free recall repair should take an average of one to several hours depending on vehicle make and model.

"Unfortunately, many consumers are not taking immediate action, either because they have ignored the repeated safety recall notices or do not understand the severity of the situation," said Patrick Juneau, who is leading a nationwide outreach program SafeAirbags.com.

"It is vitally important for consumers to pay attention to any notifications they receive and to schedule an appointment to have their airbags repaired for FREE. This literally could be a matter of life and death."

The call to action is simple.

• If consumers receive a Takata airbag recall notice, letter, postcard or e-mail, they should immediately schedule a free recall repair at a local dealership.

• Consumers uncertain whether their vehicles are part of the Takata airbag recall should www.SafeAirbags.com. They will be prompted to enter the

vehicle identification number (VIN), upload a photo of the license plate, or manually enter the plate number. The website will immediately indicate if the vehicle is currently under recall for defective Takata airbags.

• A free smartphone app, Airbag Recall, can also be downloaded, enabling consumers to take a picture of their license plate to immediately determine if a vehicle is under recall.

It takes just a few minutes to determine if a vehicle has a recalled airbag and just a few hours to have an airbag repaired. Take the time to protect yourself, your family and your friends.


